



## ORDER OF THE LANDS MANAGER

Re: Tl'unim Harvest Times

Enacted under the Wildlife and Migratory Birds Regulation  
section 5.6

YFNO 1 /2012

### BACKGROUND:


- A. Section 4.5(g)(i) of the Wildlife and Migratory Birds Regulation (the "regulation") provides that elk may not be harvested under the right to harvest wildlife between December 31 and September 1.
- B. Section 4.5(a) of the regulation provides that the times for the harvest of wildlife under the right to harvest wildlife that are permitted or prohibited under section 4.5 are subject to an order of the lands manager under section 5.6.
- C. Section 5.6 of the regulation provides that the lands manager may, by order, alter the time for harvest of wildlife prescribed by the regulation, as long as the order is not inconsistent with an approved wildlife harvest plan.
- D. The Maa-nulth First Nations Wildlife Harvest Plan for April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012 (the "Harvest Plan") sets the following times for the harvest of tl'unim (Roosevelt elk) under the right to harvest wildlife:
- a) September 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012 for immature bulls;
  - b) October 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012 for mature bulls; and
  - c) November 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012 for cows.
- E. The lands manager wishes to make an Order under section 5.6 of the regulation altering the prescribed time when the harvesting of elk is prohibited under section 4.5(g)(i) so that tl'unim may be harvested during the times set out in the Harvest Plan.

### NOW THEREFORE THE LANDS MANAGER ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) For the purposes of altering the timing of the prohibition on harvesting elk under the right to harvest wildlife, the words "elk between December 31 and September 1" in section 4.5(g)(i) of the regulation are replaced with the words "tl'unim between April 1 and August 31".
